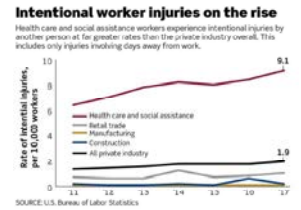

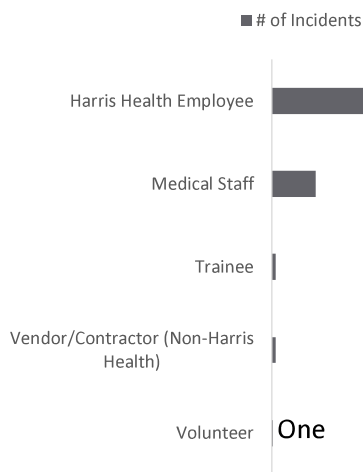

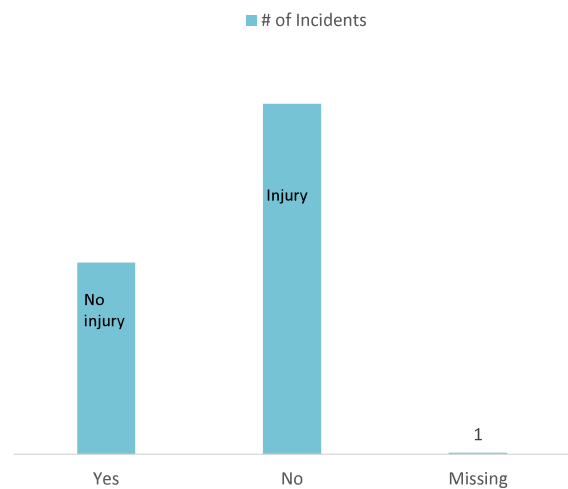
- One in five healthcare workers have been impacted by physical violence.
