Insurer Duty to Idemnify: Before Judgment or Settlement?

For decades, an insurer knew it had no duty to indemnify, if it had no duty to defend. The Texas Supreme Court, however, upended that wellsettled issue in *D.R. Horton-Tex., Ltd. v. Markel Int'l Ins.
