- Most enforcement is still by pro bono groups such as SFC (Software Freedom Conservancy)
- Informal enforcement still more common
- Formal enforcement is stepping up
- Copyright trolls are popping up

 - Drafted in response to negative publicity and trolling activity

Enforcement-Why we Care


- Compliance standards have historically been modest and faults forgiven
- Trolls (i.e. those not following the guidelines) are unforgiving of minor breaches
- · Germany is now the jurisdiction of choice
 - Code system
 - Less transparency than U.S. proceedings (confidential pleadings)
 - Ex parte injunctions
 - · Preventative injunctions
 - · Fines and criminal sanctions
 - Fee shifting
