### **SEC's Use of Data and Analytics**

- Practical considerations:
  - Insider trading
    - SEC is better at developing relationships between tippers, traders, and rings of traders
    - Conduct that used to go undetected can now be identified using data analysis tools
    - Insider trade at your own risk!
  - · Financial fraud
    - Companies could find themselves under SEC inquiry based solely on high-risk profile rankings
