ATTORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE

- The attorney-client privilege protects:
  - A communication,
  - Made between privileged persons (i.e., attorney, client or agent),
  - In confidence,
  - For the purpose of obtaining or providing legal assistance for the client.
- Courts typically construe the privilege narrowly.

	ORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE (CONT'D)
	The communication must be made for the purpose of obtaining <u>legal</u> advice, rather than business or other advice.
•	Legal advice should be the primary purpose of the communication.
	There should be an expectation that the advice will not be disclosed to others.
	The attorney's primary role in making the communication cannot be non- egal, such as giving business advice or acting as corporate secretary.
