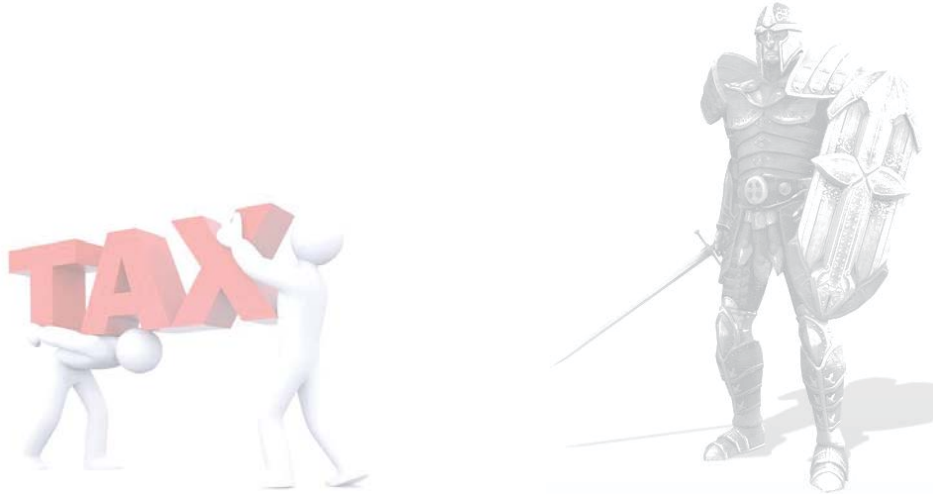


Vendor – See Indemnity as Tax

Economics – What is the most efficient way to avoid or resolve problems?

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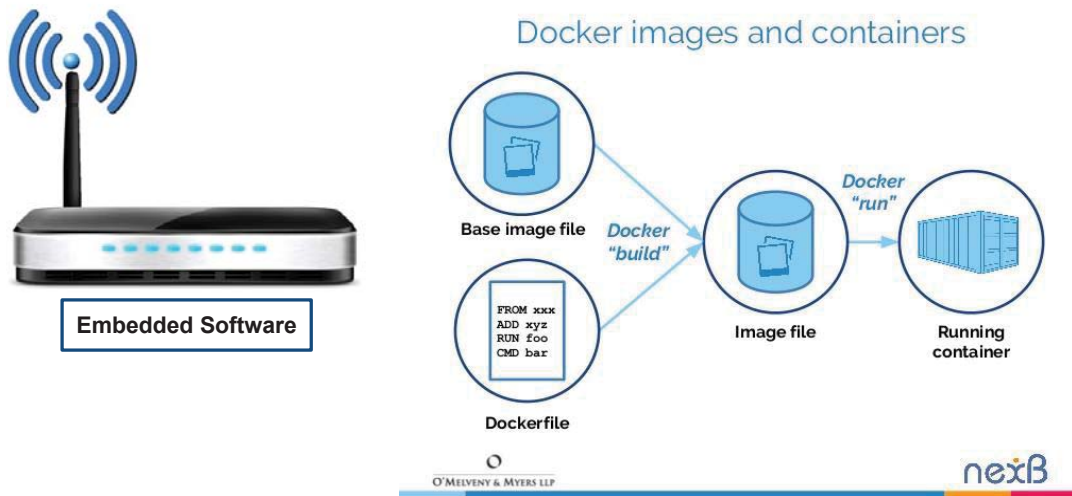

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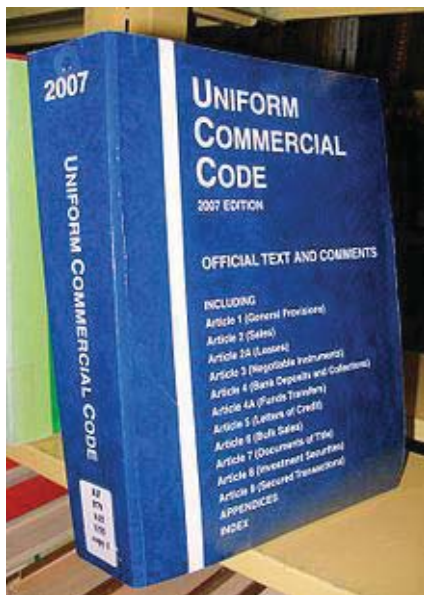
