Texas Lawyer's Creed:

"I commit myself to an adequate and effective **pro bono** program."

State Bar Resolution:

"Each Texas attorney should aspire to render at least 50 hours of *legal services to the poor* every year."

Legal Services to the poor include:

Legal services without a fee, or at a substantially reduced fee...

...rendered to a charitable, public interest organization with respect to matters or projects...

...designed predominantly to address the needs of poor persons.
