

Different types of Advisory Opinions:

- Adjudications that become "ad hoc rules."
- Opinions that go too far and become "rules."
- Informal statements/interpretive comments/answers to FAQs.
- Formal Advisory Opinions that are statutorily authorized.

- Expressly authorized by statute.
- May be binding on the agency.
- Not reviewable.
