### Overview of 501(c)(3) organizations

- Organized and operated "exclusively" for 501(c)(3) purposes:
  - E.g., charitable, scientific, educational
- Not organized for profit or primarily engaged in for-profit activity
- No violation of public policy
- Insubstantial private benefit, if any
- No inurement

# Overview of 501(c)(3) organizations (cont'd)

- No substantial lobbying activities
- No political campaign activities
- Assets distributed for 501(c)(3) purposes on dissolution
- Contributions to 501(c)(3) organizations are tax deductible as charitable contributions

### Overview of 501(c)(4) organizations

- Must primarily further social welfare, the common good and general welfare of the community
- Not organized for profit
- Not primarily engaged in for-profit activity or providing benefits to private groups
- No inurement

# Overview of 501(c)(4) organizations (cont'd)

- Unlimited lobbying in furtherance of exempt purpose
- Some political campaign activities so long as they, along with other non-exempt activities, are not primary
- Contributions to 501(c)(4) organizations are not tax deductible as charitable contributions
