What is Privacy?

- “Privacy” means how you collect, use, disclose, and dispose of personal information
 - Staff
 - Donors
 - Customers/Beneficiaries of services
- Personal Information is not just SSNs
- To many nonprofits, exposure to “privacy” may be a privacy policy on their websites

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Privacy Framework in the U.S.

U.S. does not have a national privacy law

U.S. has targeted Federal laws

- Financial, health and benefits, education, children
- Background checks
- Telecommunications and e-communications
- Federal agencies
- FTC regulation fills in the gaps for commerce

State laws

- Online privacy laws
- Biometric laws
- SSN use laws

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What is Data Protection?

- “Data Protection” means protecting against unwanted access to data, systems, and business processes
- Administrative, technical, physical safeguards
- Cannot have privacy without security
