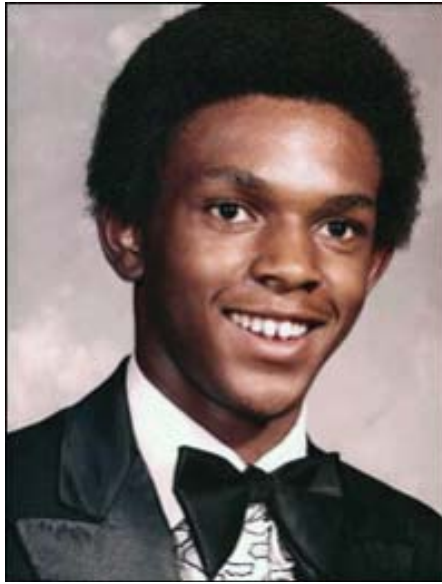

- Tim Cole Act 2009 (\$80k for each year in prison for exonerees)
- Texas Tribune 6/24/16: “Texas has has paid 101 men and women who were wrongfully sent to prison \$93.6 million over the past 25 years”

- Tim Cole Act also established the Timothy Cole Advisory Panel on Wrongful Convictions
- In 2015, the Leg formed the Timothy Cole Exoneration Review Commission to review wrongful convictions in Texas & consider possible solutions



Timothy Cole Advisory

Panel/Commission Recommendations

- 11 recommendations related to areas such as:
 - Eyewitness Identification Procedures
 - Mandatory, Automatic Discovery Procedures
 - Post-conviction Proceedings (Amend Chapter 64, Create Scientific Evidence Writ)
 - Recording Custodial Interrogations



- TX Tribune Sep. 2017: “This year, Texas legislators continued efforts to prevent wrongful convictions by passing a law focused on fixing unreliable jailhouse informants, unfair police station lineups and coerced confessions” → **HB 34**
