

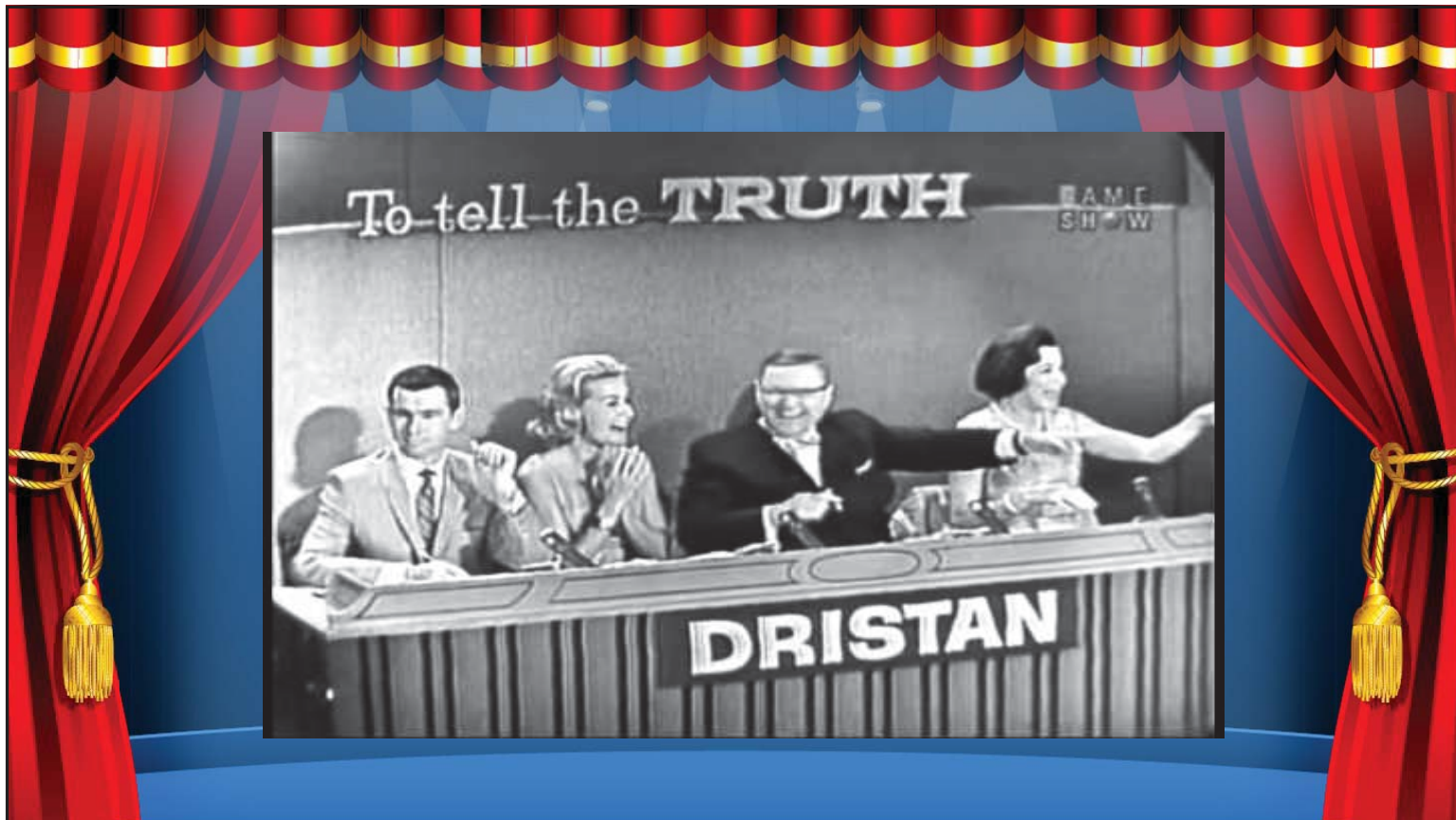
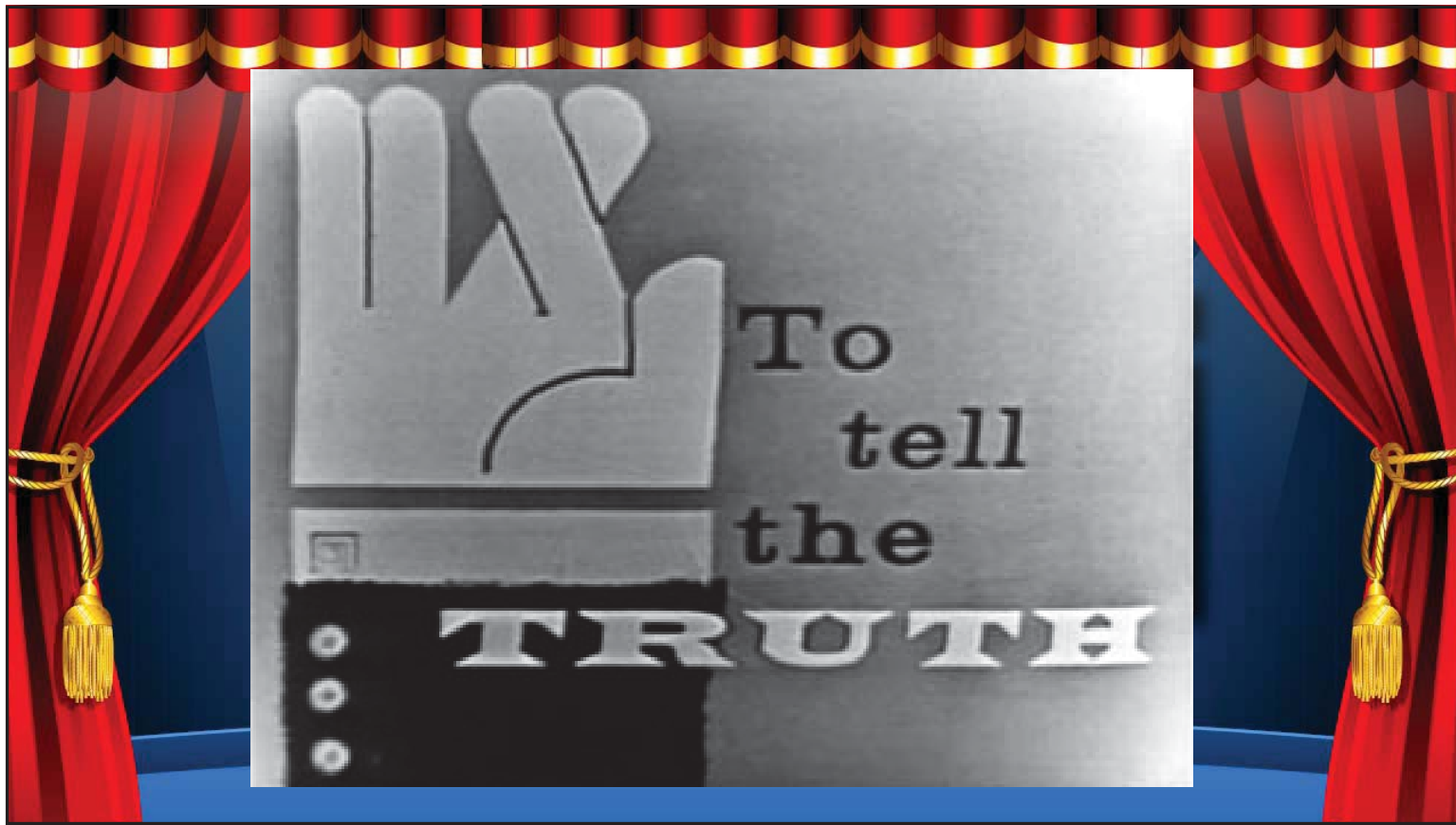

### Question 1

You retain a renowned professor as an expert witness for your product liability trial. She does not seek any compensation for her time because the topic of her opinions is personally important to her. Instead, she invites you to make a donation to a charity in her name, which you do. You assert during trial that your expert is testifying “pro bono.” After a successful trial result, you send the expert a \$30,000 “thank you” check for her time.

Are you obligated to disclose these payments to opposing counsel?



**ANSWER: Yes**

## Question 2

A judge retires from the bench. She is extremely upset about the way her former Court is handling a certain type of case that repeatedly comes up. She authors a self-published book complaining about the issue, in which she includes an example of one of these cases and a draft opinion she authored but which did not issue.

Has the judge violated the judicial code of conduct?



**ANSWER:** Probably, yes.
