Background – How did we get here?

- SB 701 (82R) (2011) Open Data Required state agencies to post high-value data sets on a generally accessible agency website. *High-value data sets include, but are not limited to, data that is critical to the financial and programmatic function of state agencies.*
- SB 279 (83R) (2013) Open Data Required state agencies to send DIR a description and link to their high value data sets.
- HB 1912 (84R) (2015) Statewide Data Coordinator Created position to collaboratively develop data policies, standards, and best practices and to improve data governance and integrity statewide.
- SB 1844 (84R) (2015) Data Study Created the Interagency Data Transparency Commission to study, report and make recommendations.
- SB 79 (85R) (2017) Public Information State agencies can respond to a Public Information Request by pointing the requestor to a website.
- HB1 (85R) (2017) Job Classifications Established job classifications for Data Officer, Data Architect and Data Analyst.

Kinds of Open Data

- Infrastructural Data
 - Data held about the state of the world for example, describing the land, transport networks, structures of government, weather measurements, etc.
 - There are very few privacy concerns about this data



Kinds of Open Data

- Public service data
 - Data about the activities of government ranging from the locations of public services and their budgets through to public registers, and detailed performance statistics on schools, hospitals and other facilities.
 - Privacy can be in a grey area as they are often built up from the aggregation of records about individual users of public services.

Kinds of Open Data

- Personal data
 - Data about individuals
 - Usually things that an individual would have a legitimate right to manage access to - such as information on their finances or their health.
