What is Special Immigrant Juvenile (SIJ) Status?

- ► SIJ status is a form of relief for non-citizen children in the U.S. who have suffered parental mistre atment.
- ▶ Who qualifies?
 - ► Children in the state's foster care system.
 - ► Children living with a non-parent care taker.
 - ► Children living with one parent.
- Once SIJ status is granted, the petitioner is eligible to adjust status when a visa number becomes available.

Obtain State Court Order Petition for SIJ Status (I-360) Apply for Lawful Permanent Residence (I-485)
