Nature of the Lease

A Conveyance and a Contract

The Bargain in Texas

Lessor is the Mineral Estate Owner / Lessee is the Oil and Gas Exploration Company (or a predecessor in interest, such as a Landman, Leasing Agent, etc.)

For a Cash Bonus, Lessor conveys a Fee Simple Determinable Interest to Lessee Lessee Then Owns the Minerals Subject to a Terminal Condition-Production Lessor Retains a Cost-Free Share of Production-Royalty, plus a Possibility of Reverter

In Other Jurisdictions, (Oklahoma, Kansas), Lessee receives *Profit a Prendre* (an exclusive right to take)

In Louisiana, Lessee Receives a Mineral Servitude

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No Standard Lease Form

Many different forms

Common include the AAPL Form 675 or the Producers 88

Most forms are drafted by Lessees

Typically

Signed only by Lessor

Grants the Minerals and Reserves the Royalty

Contains Various Authorizations to Lessee or its Successors

Courts Construe Strictly Against Lessees and Resolve Ambiguities against Drafter

When Lessor prepares forms, Lessor usually has bargaining power and forms are designed to protect Lessor

Courts Create Implied Covenants to Protect Lessors and Effectuate the Agreement

Obtain the Right, not the Obligation, to Develop for a Fixed Term
