 - Do you make them register as single-family rental properties?
 - Do you (or can you) collect hotel taxes?





RECENT CHANGES IN TECHNOLOGY AND ITS EFFECT ON LAND USE

- · Ride sharing apps.
 - Sparked a lot of controversy.
 - Competitive threat to established taxi companies.
 - Many cities adopted ordinances.
 - · State preempted municipal authority.
 - HB 100 (85th Legislature, 2017), Texas Occupations Code Chapter 2402.
 - · Zoning implications.
 - Reduction in parking requirements.
 - · Changes in design.
