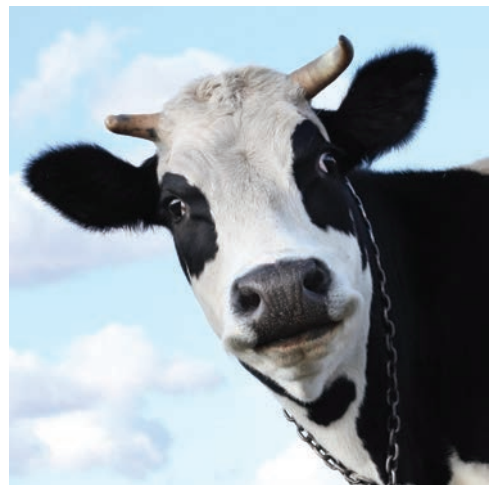

Legal Consultants

Project-based lawyers specialized in high-demand areas of expertise (litigation, healthcare, compliance, eDiscovery, data privacy)

Often required during peak workload periods and for specialized expertise that companies lack internally (strategic planning, research and analysis, and employee training)

Often engaged by small and medium-size businesses who don't have the budget to maintain full-time counsel in-house (employee misconduct, unlawful termination and compliance infractions)
