Entity Names

Determining Name Availability

SOS determines the availability of legal names for corporations, limited liability companies, limited partnerships, and professional associations as well as name reservations and name registrations.

Also applies to fictitious names if a foreign entity registers to transact business and its legal name is not available in Texas.

Names not Considered

The following are not considered when making a name availability determination:

- Assumed Names
- LLPs
- State and Federal Trademarks
- Filings with the County Clerk
- Common law use
- As a practical matter, others may have rights to a name; perform due diligence

Entity Name Availability Standard BOC §§ 5.053, 5.102 & 5.153 1 TAC §§ 79.30 – 79.46

- "Distinguishable in the Records" or "DIR"
 - no visible conflict based on SOS records
 - -Basically... unique enough!
- Same
 - name is not available, even with consent
- Available with Consent
 - name is not distinguishable but is permitted with notarized consent
