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Overview of Environmental Law

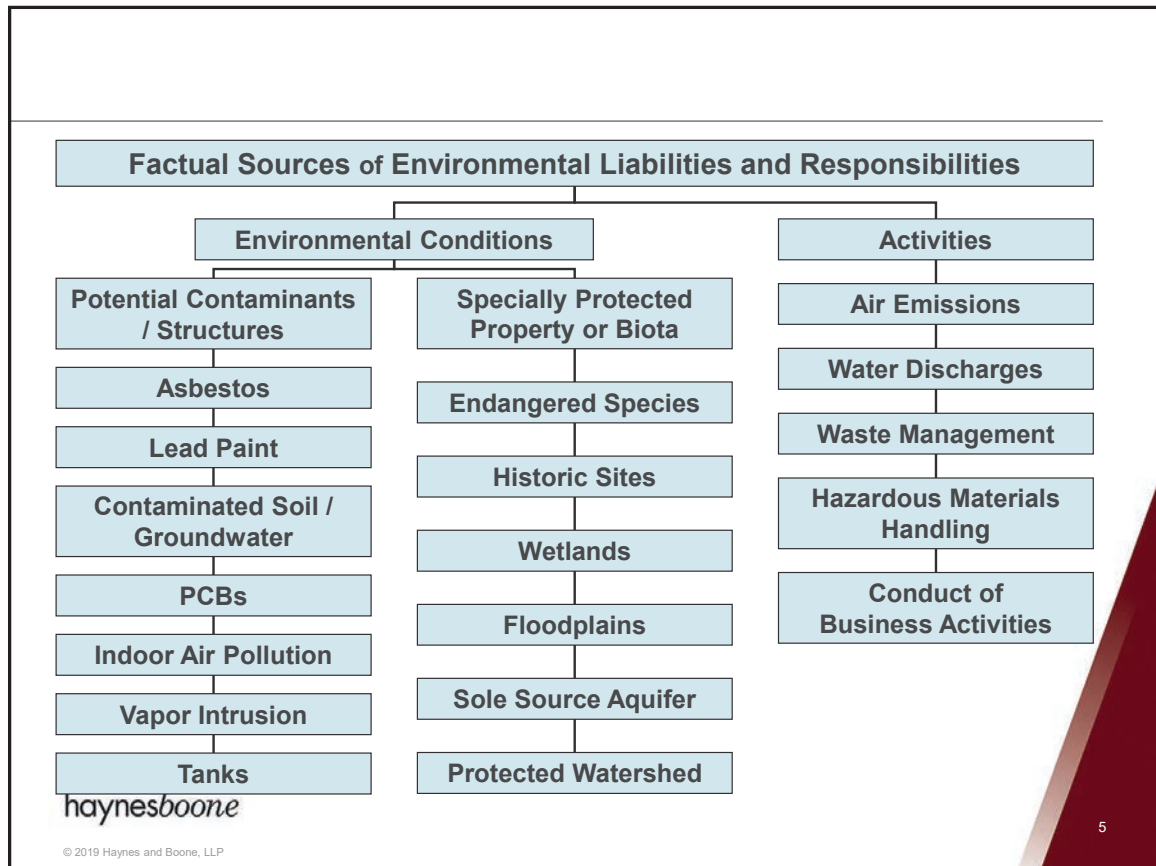
- Environmental laws are laws that regulate activities or conditions because of their effect or potential effect on public health, welfare and the environment.
