• Following its first conference, the Supreme Court has denied certiorari in a number of patent cases. In particular, the court has denied certiorari in all the patent cases ready-for-conference with the notable exception of the *Arthrex* cases focusing on appointments clause issues where certiorari was granted October 13, 2020
