



Initial Considerations

- Perfect is the enemy of the good- Voltaire
- Customize a plan and make it your own
- Build your plan with a diverse team
- Write the plan down
- Schedule time to review and update

Planning Process

- Concepts to keep in mind
 - Implement "All Hazards" approach
 - Decide what risks you accept, and what to specifically address in your plan
 - Critical vs. Non-critical functions
 - Identify critical functions of your organization and prioritize those in your plan
 - Key Personnel
 - Who is essential to implementing the plan

Planning Process

- Consider how potential hazards may impact:
 - Personnel
 - Evacuation, Education, Preparation
 - Workspace, Equipment, Property
 - ABA Ethics Opinion No. 482 and Tex. Disciplinary Rules Prof'l Conduct R. 1.14;
 - ABA Ethics Opinion 482 and ABA Model Rule 5.5 limits multijurisdictional practice by attorneys displaced by disaster.
