1 in 4 extremely low income families who need assistance receive it






AFFORDABLE AND AVAILABLE HOMES PER 100 RENTER HOUSEHOLDS

HOUSING COST BURDEN BY INCOME GROUP




Note: Renter households spending more than 30% of their income on housing costs and utilities are cost burdened; those spending more than half of their income are severely cost burdened.


Texas Urban Counties
