ISSUE:

Does a state university's dismissal of a student for poor academic performance implicate a liberty or property interest protected by the Texas Constitution's due course of law clause?

Products Liability Design Defect

Emerson Electric Co. v. Johnson, __ S.W.3d __, 2021 WL 1432226 (Tex. April 16, 2021)

ISSUE:

Were the designer and manufacturer of an HVAC compressor and terminal liable to an HVAC technician for his injuries under a products liability theory?

Negligence: Supervisory Liability

AEP Tex. Cent. Co. v. Arredondo, 612 S.W.3d 289 (Tex. Nov. 20, 2020)

ISSUES:

- (1) Whether an electric utility owed a DUTY to ensure the safe performance of its independent contractor's work.
 - (2) Whether genuine issues of material fact existed with respect to the contractor's own negligence.

Warner Bros. Entm't, Inc. v. Jones, 611 S.W.3d 1 (Tex. May 8, 2020)

ISSUE:

Whether an allegedly defamed plaintiff complied with the Defamation Mitigation Act.
