“Contract Storyline”

We shouldn't view provisions in isolation; Forming of a contract is the forming of a relationship.

Roles & Responsibilities

“Engagement” “Rush to Signing”

- Design, draft, negotiate approval of the contract
- Ensure that agreement reflects meeting of the minds
- Document Key Material Terms best way you can.
- Inhouse drives process.
- Outside counsel involvement is variable.

“Marriage” “Living the Contract”

- Understand & operationalize contract to avoid breach and to perform
- Contract obligations interpreted midstream to adapt to unanticipated storylines
- Communication – good/bad?
- Inhouse counsel lives this day-to-day, next to the Client
- (We hope not to need to call Outside Counsel)

“Break-Up” “Oh Crap. Now what?”

- Break-Up is imminent or Benefit of Marriage did not materialize
- Contract analyzed for contingencies, termination, etc.
- Dispute needs to be resolved
- Outside counsel brought in if break up is “bad”
- Inhouse conducts damage control

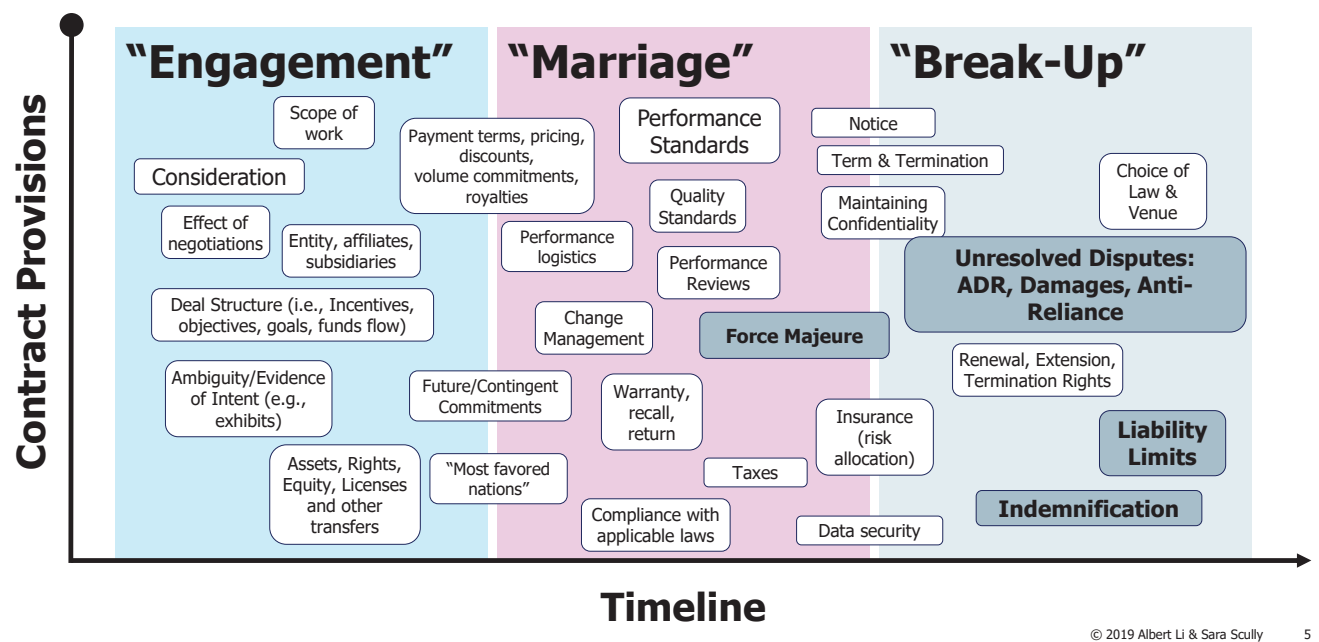
