## ENFORCEMENT UPDATE

**Most enforcement is still by pro bono groups such as SFC (Software Freedom Conservancy)**

- **New lawsuit against Vizio**
- **Settlement with Copyright Troll**
- **Trump's Truth Social Called out for AGPL Violations**

## ENFORCEMENT UPDATE -- *SFC v. Vizio*

- **New lawsuit against Vizio**
- **Software Freedom Conservancy filed a lawsuit in October 2021 against Vizio, claiming violation of the GPL and LGPL for SmartCast TVs.**
- **Breach of contract, and declaratory relief**
- **In November 2021, Vizio moved to remove to federal court**



## ENFORCEMENT UPDATE -- *SFC v. Vizio*

- Previous open source cases have all been **copyright infringement**, this is a **breach of contract** claim
- **No authors** are plaintiffs in the suit
- Pleads for **specific performance** of GPL conditions
- Contrary to all prior enforcement theories

## ENFORCEMENT UPDATE -- *SFC v. Vizio*

### Conditions and Covenants

- Open source licenses are **conditional copyright licenses**
- Rights are granted from the author (copyright owner) to each recipient
- If the conditions (notice, source code offer) are violated, the license terminates and the user becomes a copyright infringer
- Source code offer conditions have historically not been considered covenants
- Specific performance is usually not available for covenants
