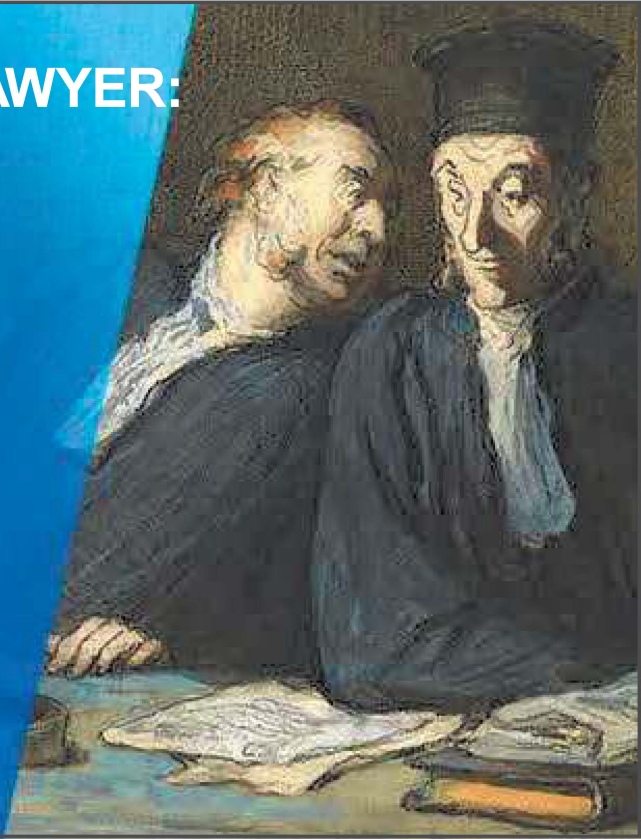

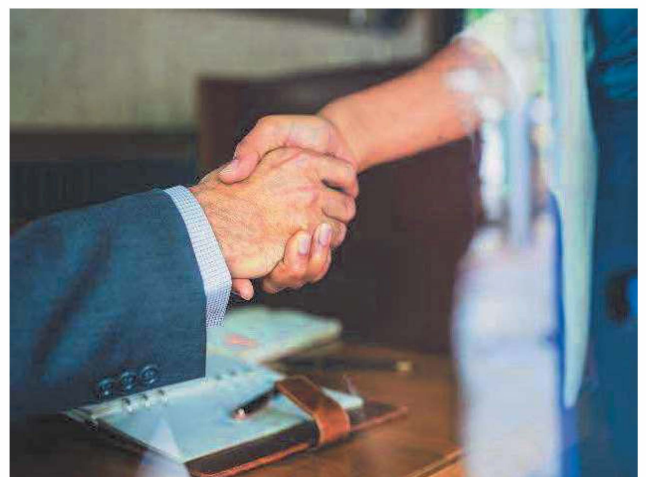

## Common elements and characteristics

High degree of fidelity

Scrupulous candor

Scrupulous good faith

Putting the benefit of  
another person above  
the actor's own benefit

## Why is this important?

- **Fiduciary duty** touches every segment of a lawyer's practice and interactions with clients, the courts, and the administration of justice.
- The **penalties** for breach of duty can be devastating to a lawyer and the lawyer's firm.
