- DHS exercising its authority to decide how to enforce immigration laws
- A focusing of finite resources
- Limited humanitarian relief

Statutory Authority for PD



The Supreme Court said:

"A principal feature of the removal system is the broad discretion exercised by immigration officials. Federal officials, as an initial matter, must decide whether it makes sense to pursue removal at all."

"Discretion [...] embraces immediate human concerns."
