

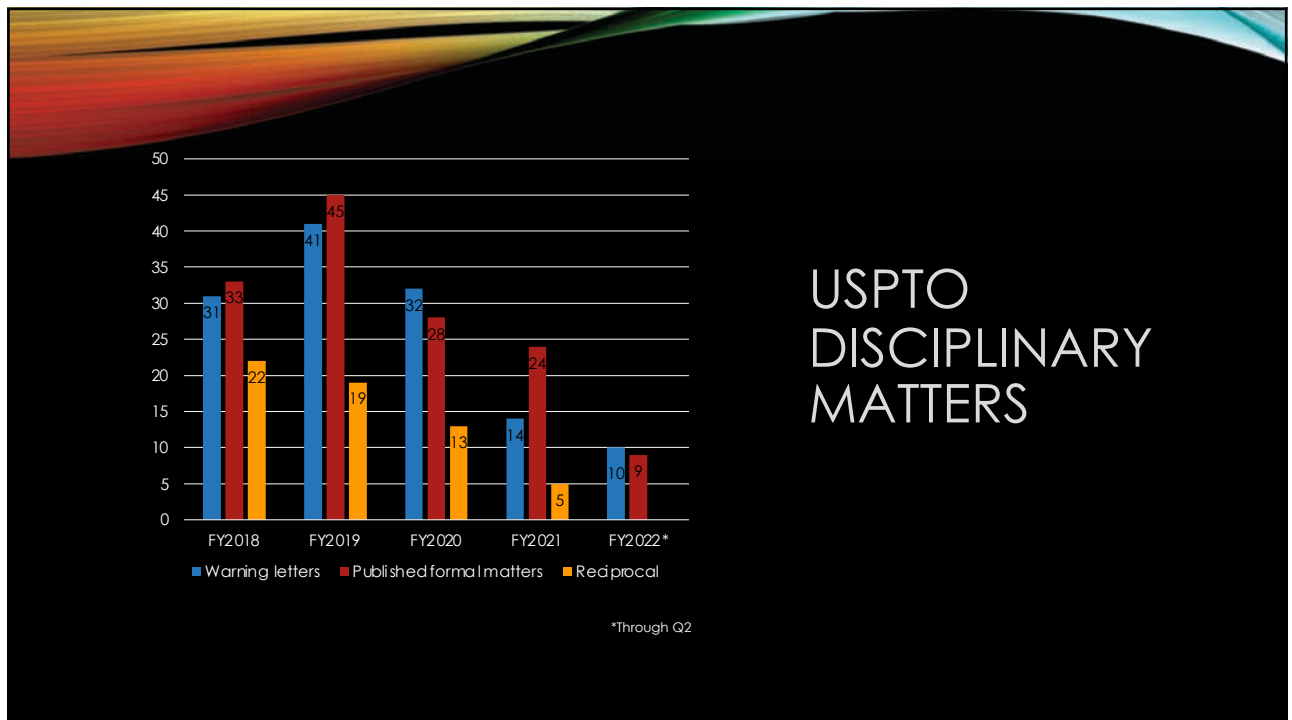

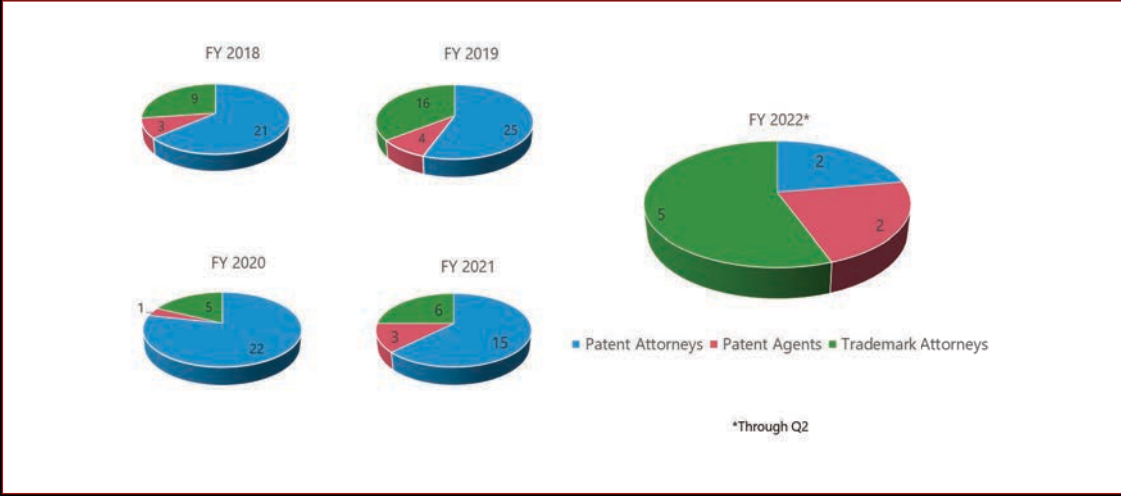

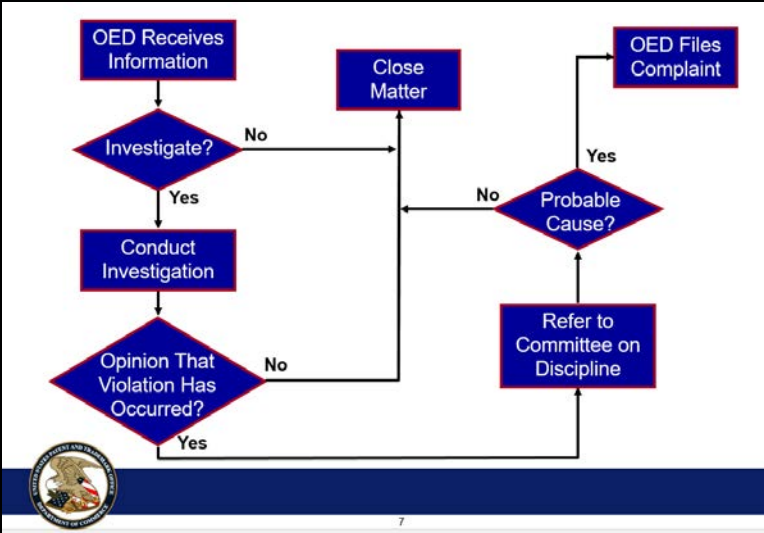

DISCIPLINARY COMPLAINTS

- 37 CFR § 11.32 – Predicated on “probable cause” by COD
- 37 CFR § 11.24 – Reciprocal discipline
- 37 CFR § 11.25 – Interim suspension based on serious criminal conviction

TIMING FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

- 35 USC § 32 – Proceedings commenced not later than earlier of:
 - 10 years after misconduct occurred; or
 - 1 year from date conduct was made known to the USPTO
