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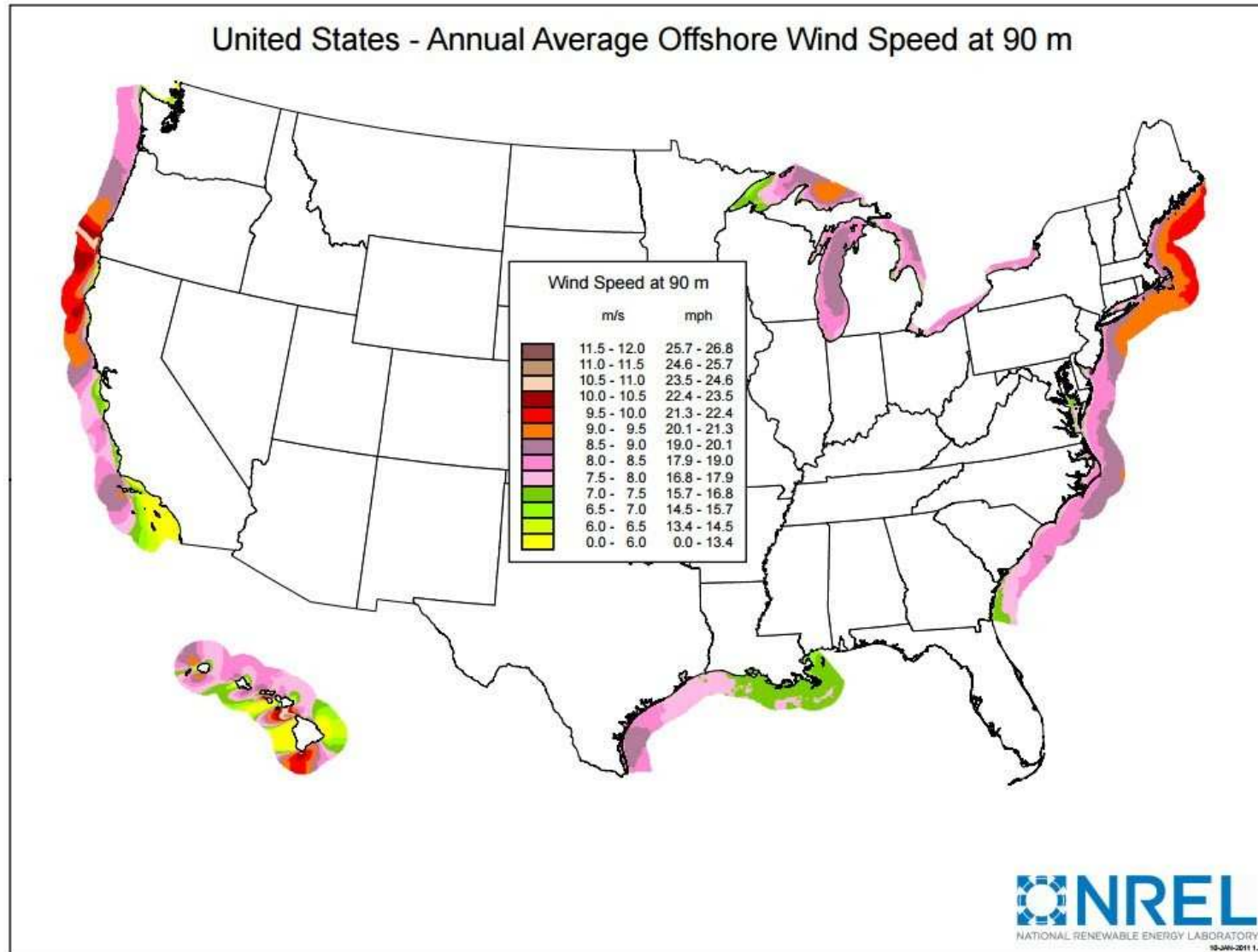
Offshore Wind What's Happening – What's Next

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U.S. Offshore Wind Potential



The National Renewable Energy Laboratory estimates that the technical resource potential for U.S. offshore wind is more than 2, gigawatts of capacity, 7,200 terawatt-hours year of generation.

U.S. Lags the World in Offshore Wind

- 42 MW Online in U.S. Compared with 31,442 MW in China and nearly 14,000 MW in the UK
- Since 2021, U.S. added 30 MW, while China added nearly 4,000 MW
